

# **Guidelines for the Tamkang University Outstanding International Student Scholarship**

Approved at the International Exchange Committee Meeting on January 16, 2026.

## **Article 1**

These Guidelines are established to provide support for international students at Tamkang University and to assist them in adapting to and sustaining their lives while studying in Taiwan (hereinafter referred to as “the Guidelines”).

## **Article 2**

This scholarship shall be awarded to outstanding international undergraduate students of Tamkang University who have been reviewed and approved by the International Student Scholarship Review Committee.

## **Article 3**

### **Eligibility, Award Amount, Quota, and Obligations**

#### **1. Eligibility:**

Applicants must be international undergraduate students currently enrolled at Tamkang University, excluding extended-study students, students from Mainland China, overseas Chinese students, and students from Hong Kong and Macao. Applicants must demonstrate outstanding academic performance, with an average academic score of 85 or above in the previous semester.

#### **2. Award Amount:**

Each recipient shall receive NT\$10,000.

#### **3. Quota:**

A total of 20 scholarships shall be awarded. The number of awards may be allocated among the colleges in proportion to the number of international students in each college.

#### **4. Obligations:**

Scholarship recipients must, within this academic year, participate in “Chat Corner” activities organized by the Office of International and Cross-Strait Affairs (OICSA) at least two times. Recipients must also complete the AI-900 training course and obtain the corresponding certification.

## **Article 4**

### **Application Procedure and Required Documents**

Applicants shall submit the following documents to the International and Mainland Students Guidance Section of the Office of International and Cross-Strait Affairs within the application period announced by the Office:

1. A copy of the academic transcript from the previous semester.
2. A letter of recommendation from the academic advisor.

## **Article 5**

### **Restriction on Concurrent Scholarships**

Students who are recipients of the Taiwan Scholarship granted by the Ministry of Education or the Taiwan Scholarship granted by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs shall not be eligible to receive this scholarship concurrently. If a recipient is found to have received multiple scholarships in violation of this provision during the award period, the scholarship already granted shall be returned.

#### **Article 6**

##### **Implementation and Amendment**

These Guidelines shall be implemented upon approval by the Committee for Internationalization and International Exchange and authorization by the President of the University, and shall take effect upon announcement. The same procedure shall apply to any amendments.
